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1. Open Learning eLearning Platform Overview

OpenLearning is a globally recognised eLearning platform that supports course delivery through social, collaborative, and learner-centred methodologies. Designed for both academic institutions and training organisations, OpenLearning offers a flexible and scalable environment for developing and managing online and blended learning experiences.

OpenLearning emphasizes community-based learning, encouraging learners to engage with content, peers, and facilitators through integrated discussion forums, shared reflections, and project-based activities.

Key Features of OpenLearning:

- 1. Social and Collaborative Learning: Emphasises community-based learning with discussion forums, shared reflections, and peer-to-peer support.








4. Module lesson structure and learning activities

The first page of each module contains the full module curriculum document which includes all details about the module including lesson content, learning objectives, assessments and other resources. Below is a screenshot showing the Module 1 curriculum document which can be viewed directly on the platform. This can also be downloaded in PDF format.









The module content is then split into lessons. Typically, each lesson contains the following elements:

1. Lesson slide presentation: The presentation contains course content related to the lesson and also goes over the activities included as seen in the screenshot below:



2. Activities – Forum / Message boards: These types of activities vary from case study discussions to reflective exercises. The students instructed to include their answers and thoughts directly on the platform in the specified text box. Below is an example of the first activity in Module 1 – Lesson 1:
